

While I'm on the issue of early Christian diversity, I thought it might be useful to post a video that I did over ten years ago now on my first book written to address that theme, *Lost Christianities: The Battles for Scripture and the Faiths We Never Knew* . In the discussion I talked about early (alternative) forms of Christianity and about how they came to be suppressed, reformed, or forgotten.
